



Outdoor/Indoor Play



Play is a natural way for young children to discover and make sense of the world around them.

Infants: To minimize your baby's distraction during feeding time, try a darkened or quiet spot.

<u>Toddlers:</u> Fly Swatter Painting-use a fly swatter, paint, and paper to create a masterpiece.

<u>Preschoolers:</u> Plant a garden with your child- you will need seeds, individual planting pot/ container, potting soil or seed sorting mix, gardening tools and a water pail.

Infants: During feeding time, hold your infant's foot in your hand and count his toes in a sweet, sing-song way.

<u>Toddlers:</u> Investigate your yard with a magnifying glass-have a discussion about what you see.

<u>Preschoolers:</u> Continue planting and grooming your garden. <u>Use this link to learn more about gardening with children</u>

<u>Infants:</u> Finish feeding time with your infant with a hug, letting them know how strong they have become and how much you love them.

Infants: Play a game of Peek-aboo by hiding behind your hands, a blanket, a stuffed animal, or even a door.

<u>Toddlers:</u> Stack and balance rocks- try other objects to see if they can be stacked or balanced.

<u>Preschoolers:</u> Have your child take drawing paper outside to draw a picture of the clouds.

Infants: Hold a rattle out for your baby to take. Dance and sing along as he/she shakes the rattle.

<u>Toddlers:</u> Create your own water play table—you will need a plastic tub, beach toys, turkey baster, funnel, measuring cups, etc. Enjoy!

<u>Preschoolers:</u> Make playdough together with your child—<u>Playdough Recipe and demonstration.</u>


