
Parent Tip: Involve your child in meal planning. Discuss the weekly menu and eat together every night as a family.

Outdoor/Indoor Play



Play is a natural way for young children to discover and make sense of the world around them.

<u>Infants:</u> Diapering is a great time to bond with your child. Talk to your child about the steps it takes to change their diaper, name the items used, etc.

<u>Toddlers:</u> Sit with your child and look through a magazine or book of pictures. Point at the pictures and name each one.

<u>Preschoolers:</u> Take a nature walk, collecting various things along the way (e.g. rocks, sticks, leaves, etc.). Use these items to spell out your name.

Infants: Use Real Words: When talking to your infant, use real words spoken in a soft, sing-song way instead of using "baby talk" or simply making silly noises.

<u>Toddlers:</u> Enjoy a day outside by running, jumping, and climbing.

<u>Preschoolers:</u> Use chalk to write sight words on the sidewalk. Have an adult to call out each sight word as the child uses water to erase them.

Infants: Cuddle up with a good booksit in a soft spot and hold your infant in your arms as you read to them.

<u>Toddlers:</u> Play a game of sponge target. Draw a target with washable paint on a plastic surface. With a wet sponge, aim for the bull's eye.

<u>Preschoolers:</u> Take an outdoor walk, have your child document what they hear on a sheet of paper.

Infants: Use your infant's name often to show them how much you care for them.

Toddlers: Identify the Feeling:
Take an old magazine and cut out pictures of children displaying various emotions. Sit with your child and talk about how the children are feeling.

<u>Preschoolers:</u> With adult supervision, ride a bike or scooter around the block.

<u>Infants:</u> Babbles and Coos: copy the sounds your infant makes.

<u>Toddlers:</u> Enjoy a game of freeze with music.

<u>Preschoolers:</u> Have an ice cream taste test with a few of your favorite flavors. See if your child can guess the flavor based on the smell and taste.
