- ☐ Hand wash before center play and hand wash before moving to a new center or activity.
- \Box Wear masks over the age of 3
- ☐ Limit number of children per activity to 2-3 with space
- Children and teachers need to stay in the same class and group every day.
- ☐ (Teachers and children SHALL NOT CHANGE FROM ONE GROUP TO ANOTHER)
- ☐ If more than one group of children is cared for at one facility, each group shall be in a separate room and not mix or interact with each other.
- ☐ Sanitize play areas between children transitioning to a new play area. (i.e. when playing in Centers A, C, E, be sanitizing centers B, D, and F.)
- ☐ Sanitize flat surfaces regularly between activities.
- ☐ Contaminated clothes should be placed in a plastic bag or washed in a washing machine.

- ☐ Toys that children have placed in their mouths or that are otherwise contaminated by body secretions or excretions should be set aside until they are cleaned by hand by a person wearing gloves. Clean with water and detergent, rinse, sanitize with an EPA-registered disinfectant.
- ☐ Do not share toys with other groups of infants or toddlers, unless they are washed and sanitized before being moved from one group to the other.
- ☐ Set aside toys that need to be cleaned. (i.e in yuck bucket.

Things to Consider:

- ☐ Toys that cannot be cleaned and sanitized should <u>not</u> be used at this time
- ☐ Machine washable cloth toys should be used by one individual at a time or should not be used at all. These toys should be laundered **before** being used by another child.



- ☐ Intensify cleaning and disinfection efforts, including devising a schedule, and focus on toys, games, and other objects and surfaces that are frequently used
- ☐ Be mindful of items more likely to be placed in children's mouth
- Have extra toys to rotate in and out as you are sanitizing others.

- ☐ Have extra toys to rotate in and out as you are sanitizing others.
