

Play is a natural way for young children to discover and make sense of the world around them.



Infants: Give your baby some much needed "tummy time" to strengthen your baby's neck and upper-body muscles.

Toddlers & Preschoolers:

Encourage children to move like different zoo animals. Example: hop like a kangaroo, etc.

Infants: Hold a rattle out for your baby to take. Dance and sing along as he/she shakes the rattle.

Toddlers Have children "paint" using water and paintbrushes on the sidewalk or cement area.
