
Parent Tip: Paint with Vehicles! Add some trucks, tractors, and cars to some paint and paper and compare the tracks that they make!



Outdoor/Indoor Play



Play is a natural way for young children to discover and make sense of the world around them.

Infants: Let's read a
"Transportation Book" Point to the
pictures as you read while engaging
your child by changing your voice to
make different vehicle sounds.

Toddlers & Preschoolers: "Create a Sensory Table": Use sand (or dirt) and add small cars or other means of transportation.

Infants: "Car Stacking" Stack 2 or 3 cars, encouraging your child to knock them down.

<u>Toddlers</u> "Tip Like a Dump Truck" Tip side to side!

Preschoolers: Tape a maze on your floor/ground and add some numbers. Have your child drive and count their way through the maze.

Infants: Create a "Shaker Bottle" using an empty 16oz bottle, colored rice, or pasta. Glue the top back on. Hear want happens as you encourage your child to shake, rattle, and roll the container.

Toddlers & Preschoolers: Set out some flour to explore and play with. Add vehicles for some hauling and track making! Infants: Play a game of Peek-aboo by leaving part of a transportation vehicle showing. Then ask your child, "where is it"? and encourage him/her to look for it.

Toddlers & Preschoolers: "Petal your Bike" Sit in a chair and move your legs or lay on your back and pedal your legs above your head!
