
"The true story of the 3 little pigs" By Jon Scieszka

"Goldilocks And the Three Dinosaurs" By Mo Willems




Use this_link to hear the story read aloud.

Outdoor/Indoor Play



Play is a natural way for young children to discover and make sense of the world around them.

Infants: Clap your hands three times while saying "clap, clap, clap" and then take your child's hand and help him/her make the clapping motion while saying clap, clap, clap.

Toddlers & Preschoolers: "Pigs in a Blanket" Heat hotdogs up and roll them in a slice of bread. Pretend to be wolves eating the pigs. Infants: Look at family photos pointing out who people are and what they are doing.

<u>Toddlers</u> Run in place and run across the room to get away from the dinosaurs.

Preschoolers: "Be seated"
Pretend to sit in a chair and
notice how low you can sit down.


