<p>Infants: "Walk the Dog" (push toy) - Leg strength</p> <p>Toddlers: Hop like a Bunny!</p> <p>Preschoolers: "Pet House" If you have a large appliance box, help your child decorate it and turn it into a pet house. Have your child take the pets for a walk, runs, etc. and then place them in the house to rest.</p>	<p>Infants: Crawl like a turtle – Encourage your baby to crawl to you.</p> <p>Toddlers: Encourage your child to paint a picture of their pet, or a pet they'd like to have.</p> <p>Preschoolers: Plan to visit a pet store. When you return, discuss, and make a list of all the pets you saw.</p>	<p><u>School Age</u></p> <p>Animal Sounds for Kids</p> <p>Teaching Kids to Care for Pets</p>  <p>The Best Pets for Kids</p>	<p>Infants: "Where did puppy go? Play peek-a-boo with a variety of stuffed animals.</p> <p>Toddlers: Crawl and meow like a cat.</p> <p>Preschoolers: "Guess My move!" Let each child take a turn pretending to be an animal and let the other children guess!</p>	<p>Infants: "Puppy Kisses" Cuddle up with your baby - shower him/her with hugs and kisses.</p> <p>Toddlers: Bark and walk like a dog.</p> <p>Preschoolers: "Pet Toss" Place pillows out and provide stuffed animals. Have your child practice tossing a stuffed animal onto the pillow.</p>
