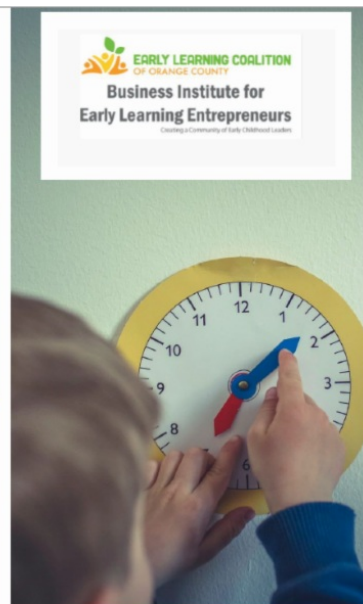

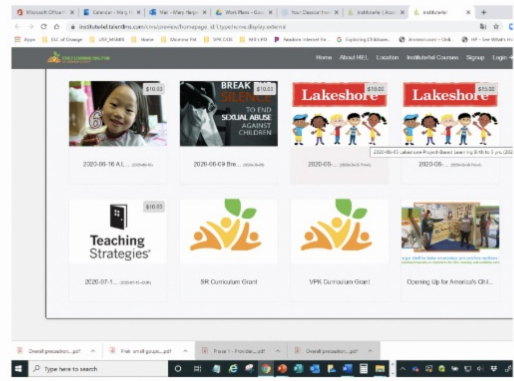

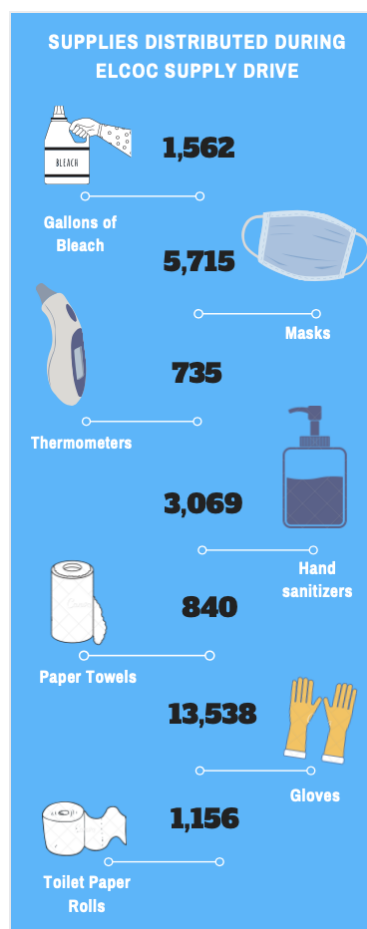
Child Care Supply Distribution Wrap-up

FOLLOW SAFE DIAPER CHANGING PROCEDURES.

Remember: Always keep a hand on the child.

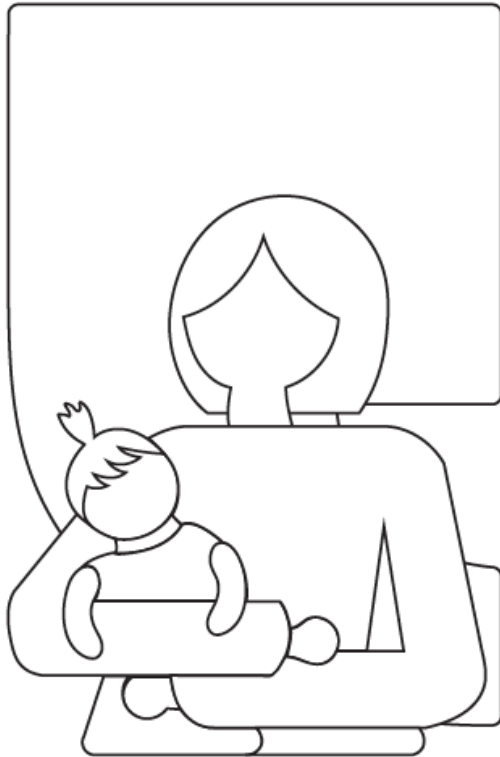
-  Before starting, wash both your hands and the child's hands.
-  Wear gloves and clean the child.
-  Remove trash (soiled diaper and wipes)
-  Replace diaper.
-  Wash child's hands.
-  Clean and disinfect diaper station, then wash your hands.

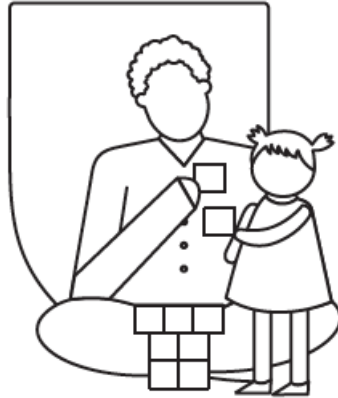

you could talk about the:

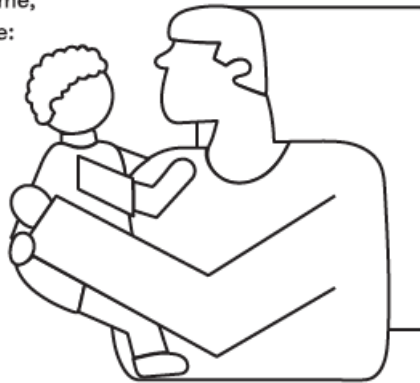
- tall tower

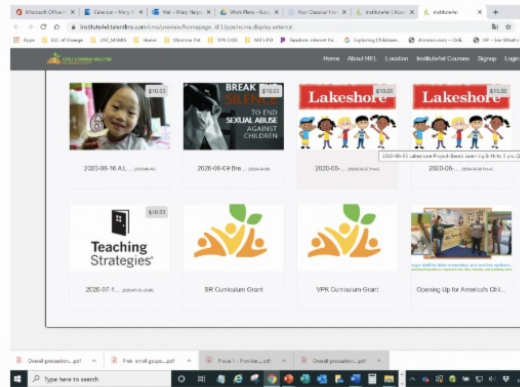

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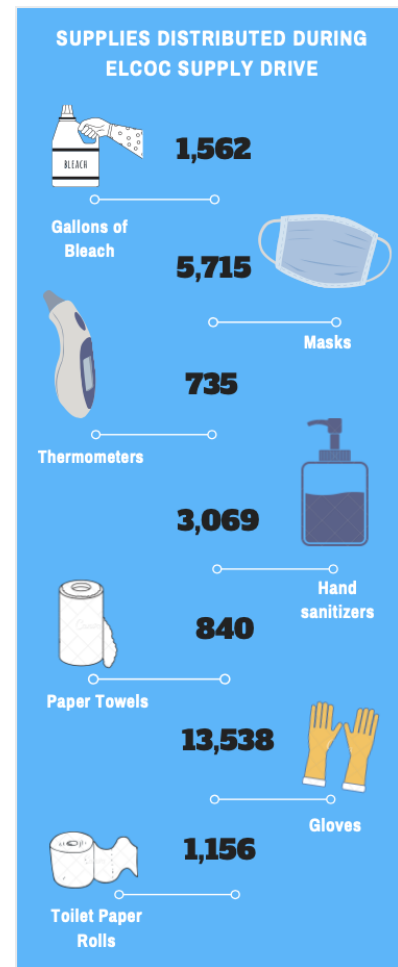
