Early Learning Coalition of Orange County Request for Proposals (RFP) to Provide Early Childhood Mental Health Consultation (ECMHC) Services

I. INTRODUCTION

The ORANGE COUNTY SCHOOL READINESS COALITION, INC. d/b/a EARLY LEARNING COALITION OF ORANGE COUNTY (Coalition) located at 7700 Southland Blvd. Ste 100, Orlando, FL 32809 will accept Proposals with Statements of Qualifications from Early Childhood Mental Health Agencies for early childhood mental health consultation services from qualified Early Childhood Mental Health agencies serving the Central Florida area. Please consider this communication a formal Request for Proposals (RFP), responses to which will be used to determine the best-qualified firm for these services and will be the basis for negotiating a contract.

The Coalition and the Foundation are both not-for-profit corporations organized under the laws of the state of Florida and have been determined exempt by the Internal Revenue Service under the provisions of IRS Code, Section 501(c)(3). The Florida Office of Early Learning has certified the Coalition as a local early learning coalition for the purposes of implementing programs authorized by Florida Statute Chapter 411.01 and part V of Chapter 1002. Our principal function is the provision of oversight, and policy guidance to the early childhood School Readiness and Voluntary Prekindergarten Education systems in Orange County, Florida.

Services estimated to begin **March 1, 2024,** through **February 28, 2025**. Renewal will be dependent upon continued funding.

Renewal: Any contract resulting from this RFP will be based on an initial contract. Renewals shall be contingent upon the availability of funds, satisfactory performance evaluations by the Coalition, and at the discretion of the Coalition. Renewal must be in writing and is subject to the same terms and conditions set forth in the initial contract and any written amendments signed by the parties. The price of the commodity or contractual service to be renewed must be specified in the bid, proposal, or reply, except that an agency may negotiate lower pricing. A renewal contract may not include any compensation for costs associated with the renewal.

II. STATEMENT OF WORK

The Coalition seeks to contract for the provision of early childhood mental health consultation (ECMHC) services to early childhood programs in Orange County for the purpose of supporting young children's optimal mental health. This funding will also provide support to early childhood teachers, directors and staff who work with young children and their families. Early childhood mental health consultation services will be provided on a regular, weekly schedule to identify early childhood programs serving school readiness and voluntary prekindergarten children. Services must be provided by clinicians trained in the Georgetown Model of Early Childhood and Parent Child Interactive Therapy (PCIT). Qualified staff with appropriate experience and education in working with children birth to five years of age and in early childhood settings required. The Coalition seeks to contract with a mental health agency with consultants who have specific content knowledge appropriate to the provision of early childhood mental health consultation services in culturally diverse early learning settings within our community.

Services will be provided onsite with early learning providers identified by the Coalition. Agency ECMH consultants will participate in introductory meetings with Coalition staff, work to establish relationships with classroom staff, directors, and family child care providers. ECMH consultant time must be allocated in an equitable manner between all age groups in participating programs. The focus of classroom interactions should be offered in a reflective and asset-based approach. **re**

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Time on site: Depending upon the early learning program needs and size, the ECMH consultant may spend an estimated 4-6 hours per visit per week per site. Initially in the consultation delivery, more time will be spent with meetings/introductions and classroom/site relationship building activities. The ECMH consultant will then transition to providing individual classroom teacher and program support which may include workshops, support groups and trainings.

Generally, time allocation in the Early Childhood Mental Health Consultation Model may be divided as follows:

- General Classroom Consultation and Observations 40%
- Staff training- 10%
- Family consultations 5%
- Programmatic Consultation- 15%
- Individualized Child and Family Centered observations and consultation- 20%
- Write-up/analysis of assessment and observation data- 5%
- Preparing for presentations/trainings, and other misc.- 5%

The ECMHC consultant will perform a broad range of services as part of this contract. The ECMH consultant will also collect data, maintain records, and support compliance in all facets of performance standards and state regulations. Services will include, but may not be limited to, the following: management consultations, classroom/staff support and consultation, family and teacher consultations, classroom observations, writeup/analysis of assessment and observation data, preparation of material for trainings and presentations, attendance at staff meetings, trainings and or family events, and mental wellness trainings for staff & families. Additional component services may be added to address the specific needs of individual early learning programs.

- 1. Introduction Meetings the purpose of the initial meeting is to introduce the concept of ECMH Consultation to all staff at the participating early childhood program. There should also be an opportunity to introduce families to the ECMH consultant at the onset of the provision of services.
- 2. Classroom Relationship Building the ECMH consultant will begin with time in classrooms to establish relationships with teachers and children in each early learning setting as well as to understand each program.
- 3. The following tools may be used to track data: Classroom Environmental Observation Form, Classroom Engagement Observation Form, The Pyramid Infant Toddler Observation Scale (TPITOS), Teaching Pyramid Observation Tool (TPOT) Short Form, Classroom Behavior Record-Program-Wide Expectations Form
- 4. Support Meetings/Check-ins the ECMH consultant will schedule times to review and offer support to teachers. This may consist of direct support or further observations as well as recommendations for classroom interventions to address challenging behaviors.
- 5. The ECMH Consultant may provide wellness support which can include mini trainings and workshops, which could include Taking Care of Ourselves training, that can be provided to staff and/or families, Infant/Early Childhood Mental Health & Impact of Trauma on Behavior, Wellness workshops, Support Group time as needed and indicated by ECMH Consultant and early learning program participants. Additional family workshops and presentations may be included as needed.
- 6. Data Analysis- the ECMH consultant may provide write-up and assessment data gathered during observations (see observation tools named in the outline above) or implementation tools and information for interventions to early learning programs.

The selected agency will be responsible for working collaboratively with established Coalition and community referral partners as indicated. This contract does not allow for the provision of direct therapeutic services to young children. Children who may be identified as in need of further evaluation will be referred to the ELCOC's Inclusion Team for further assistance. When appropriate, guidelines for the Department of Children and Families (DCF) licensing and Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act (HIPAA) and the Family Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA) must be followed.

Limitations: per funding requirements, the ECMH consultant is to provide support for coalition, providers, teachers, directors, and not provide direct services to children. Children who may be identified as in need of further evaluation will be referred to the ELCOC's Inclusion Team for further assistance.

A. Notice of Intent to Submit a Proposal

As a condition of submitting a proposal, vendors are required to submit a Notice of Intent to Submit a Proposal form (Exhibit 1) which shall set forth the name and address of the firm participating in this solicitation and which bears the original signature of an authorized agent of the Proposer no later than the date specified on Section III to the Point of Contact and address listed in Section III. The submission of the Notice of Intent is mandatory and will provide the Coalition with the address and contact person for each Proposer so that any notices of action can be forwarded appropriately. Failure to submit a Notice of Intent by the deadline may preclude a prospective Proposer from submitting a response for this solicitation and will render the proposer's reply non-responsive and will result in rejection of the respondent's proposal.

The original signature must be of the designated agent officially authorized to act as the contractual agent for the organization or collaborative partnership. The Coalition will accept electronic signatures.
- 3. To be considered for evaluation, a respondent's Proposal must conform to the content and format requirements described herein. All supporting documentation and Exhibits shall be named separately and clearly referenced.

- 4. All supporting documents must directly relate to the Application being submitted. Proposals may not exceed 18 pages (excluding the budget pages and mandated signed documents and/or certifications).
- 5. Please submit your response to this RFP no later than 1<u>2:00 PM on Friday, February 2, 2024</u>. Responses received after 12:00 PM on this date <u>will not</u> be considered.

Respondents to this solicitation or persons acting on their behalf may not contact, between the release of the solicitation and the end of the 72-hour period following the Coalition posting the notice of intended award, excluding Saturdays, Sundays, and state holidays, any employee or Board Member concerning any aspect of this solicitation, except in writing to the sole Point of Contact or as provided in the solicitation documents. Violation of this provision may be grounds for rejecting a response.

J. Cost of Preparation of Proposal

The Coalition is not liable for any costs incurred by the Respondent in replying to this RFP.

- **K.** <u>Insurance</u>. The Respondent is required to maintain commercial insurance of such a type and with such terms and limits as may be reasonable associated with the resulting contract.
- L. <u>Licenses</u>, <u>Permits and Taxes</u>. The Proposer shall pay for all licenses, permits, and taxes required for this project. In addition, the Proposer shall comply with all federal, state, and local codes, laws, ordinances, regulations and other requirements applicable to the work specified in this solicitation at no additional cost to the Coalition.

M. Special Provisions

- Immigration and Nationalization Act. The Coalition shall consider the employment by any Respondent of unauthorized aliens a violation of section 274A (e) of the Immigration and Nationalization Act. If the contractor knowingly employs unauthorized aliens, such violation shall be cause for rejection of the proposal or, if subsequently discovered, for unilateral cancellation of the Contract.
- 2. <u>Warranty of Authority</u>. Each person signing the attachments and subsequent contract(s) warrants that he or she is duly authorized to do so and bind the respective party to the contract.

- 3. <u>Convicted Vendors</u>. A person or affiliate placed on the convicted vendor list following a conviction for a public entity crime is prohibited from doing any of the following for a period of 36 months from the date of being placed on the convicted vendor list:
 - submitting a bid on a contract to provide any goods or services to a public entity;
 - submitting a bid on a contract with a public entity for the construction or repair of a public building or public work;
 - submitting bids on leases of real property to a public entity;
 - being awarded or performing work as a contractor, supplier, subcontractor, or consultant under a contract with any public entity; and
 - transacting business with any public entity in excess of the Category Two threshold amount (\$25,000) provided in section 287.017 of the Florida Statutes.
 - any proposal received from a person or affiliate who has been placed on the convicted vendor list shall be rejected by the Coalition as an unresponsive proposal and shall not be further evaluated.
- 4. <u>Discriminatory Vendors</u>. An entity or affiliate placed on the discriminatory vendor list pursuant to section 287.134 of the Florida Statutes may not:
 - submit a bid on a contract to provide any goods or services to a public entity;
 - submit a bid on a contract with a public entity for the construction or repair of a public building or public work;
 - submit bids on leases of real property to a public entity;
 - be awarded or perform work as a contractor, supplier, sub-contractor, or consultant under a contract with any public entity; or
 - transact business with any public entity.
- 5. <u>Failure to Perform Prior Contracts</u>. Failure to have performed any contractual obligations with the Coalition in a manner satisfactory to the Coalition will be a sufficient cause for disqualification. To be disqualified as a Proposer under this provision, the Proposer must have:
 - Previously failed to satisfactorily perform in a contract with the Coalition, been notified by the Coalition of the unsatisfactory performance, and failed to correct the unsatisfactory performance to the satisfaction of the Coalition; or,
 - Had a contract terminated for cause by the Coalition, by any agency of the State of Florida, or by any Children's Services Council.
 - The Proposer or any of its staff have participated in the development and review of the RFP documents for this Solicitation.
- 6. Respondent's Representation and Authorization. In submitting a response, each respondent understands, represents, and acknowledges the following (if the respondent cannot so certify to any of following, the respondent shall submit with its response a written explanation of why it cannot do so):
 - The respondent is not currently under suspension or debarment by the State or any other governmental authority.
 - To the best of the knowledge of the person signing the response, the respondent, its
 affiliates, subsidiaries, directors, officers, and employees are not currently under
 investigation by any governmental authority and have not in the last ten (10) years

- been convicted or found liable for any act prohibited by law in any jurisdiction, involving conspiracy or collusion with respect to bidding on any public contract.
- Respondent currently has no delinquent obligations to the State, including a claim by the State for liquidated damages under any other contract.
- The submission is made in good faith, prices and amounts -actual or approximatehave been arrived at independently and not pursuant to any consultation, agreement or discussion with, or inducement from, or disclosed to, any firm or person to submit a complementary or other noncompetitive response. Nor they will be disclosed before the opening of the proposals.
- The respondent has made a diligent inquiry of its employees and agents responsible
 for preparing, approving, or submitting the response, and has been advised by each
 of them that he or she has not participated in any communication, consultation,
 discussion, agreement, collusion, act or other conduct inconsistent with any of the
 statements and representations made in the response.
- The respondent has fully informed the Coalition in writing of all convictions of the firm, its affiliates (as defined in section 287.133(1)(a) of the Florida Statutes), and all directors, officers, and employees of the firm and its affiliates for violation of state or federal antitrust laws with respect to a public contract for violation of any state or federal law involving fraud, bribery, collusion, conspiracy or material misrepresentation with respect to a public contract. This includes disclosure of the names of current employees who were convicted of contract crimes while in the employment of another company.
- Neither the respondent nor any person associated with it in the capacity of owner, partner, director, officer, principal, investigator, project director, manager, auditor, or position involving the administration of federal funds has:
 - within the preceding three years been convicted of or had a civil judgment rendered against them or is presently indicted for or otherwise criminally or civilly charged for: commission of fraud or a criminal offense in connection with obtaining, attempting to obtain, or performing a federal, state, or local government transaction or public contract; violation of federal or state antitrust statutes; or commission of embezzlement, theft, forgery, bribery, falsification or destruction of records, making false statements, or receiving stolen property; or
 - within a three-year period preceding this certification had one or more federal, state, or local government contracts terminated for cause or default.
 - The product or service offered by the respondent will conform to the specifications without exception.
 - The respondent has read and understands the terms and conditions, and the submission is made in conformance with those terms and conditions.
 - If an award is made to the respondent, the respondent agrees that it intends to be legally bound to the Contract that is formed with the Coalition.
 - The respondent shall indemnify, defend, and hold harmless the Coalition and its employees against any cost, damage, or expense which may be incurred or be caused by any error in the respondent's preparation of its bid.
 - All information provided by, and representations made by, the respondent are material and important and will be relied upon by the Coalition in awarding the Contract. Any

- misstatement shall be treated as fraudulent concealment from the Respondent of the true facts relating to submission of the bid. A misrepresentation shall be punishable under law, including, but not limited to, Chapter 817 of the Florida Statutes.
- 7. Electronic Posting of Notice of Intended Award. Based on the evaluation, on the date indicated on the Schedule of Events, the Coalition shall electronically post a notice of intended award at www.elcoc.org/whoweare/financials/procurement. If the notice of award is delayed, in lieu of posting the notice of intended award the Coalition shall post a notice of the delay and a revised date for posting the notice of intended award. Any person who is adversely affected by the decision shall file with the Coalition a notice of protest within 72 hours after the electronic posting. The Coalition shall not provide tabulations or notices of award by telephone. Failure to file a protest within the time prescribed in section 120.58(3), Florida Statutes (F.S.), or failure to post the bond or other security required by law within the time allowed for filing a bond shall constitute a waiver of proceedings under Chapter 120, F.S. (Ss. 120.57(3)(a), and Ss. 287.042(2), F.S.).
- 8. Minor Irregularities/Right to Reject. The Coalition reserves the right to waive any minor irregularity, technicality, or omission and to accept or reject any and all bids, or separable portions thereof, if the Coalition determines that doing so will serve the State's best interests. The Coalition has at its sole discretion, the absolute right to cancel, amend, modify, supplement or clarify this RFP solicitation at any time. The Coalition may reject any response not submitted in the manner specified by the solicitation documents.
- 9. Addenda. Any changes to the RFP will be done by addendum. Any proposal that fails to incorporate all addenda will be deemed non-responsive. The Coalition has the absolute right to cancel, amend, modify, supplement or clarify this solicitation at any time at its sole discretion. If any solicitation revisions become necessary or appropriate, as determined by the Coalition, the Coalition will email a notice to those Proposers who submitted a Notice of Intent to Submit a Proposal to the Coalition. Any additions to this document issued by the Coalition will be posted at www.elcoc.org/whoweare/financials/procurement. Proposers are responsible for checking the website. If proposers should experience any problems, they can inform the sole Point of Contact for this solicitation via email with explanation of problem; the proposer must write on subject line: RFP 2122-01 concern.
- 10. Withdrawal of Proposal. A written request for withdrawal, signed by the Proposer, may be considered if received by the Coalition within 72-hours after the Proposal opening time and date indicated in the Calendar of Events. A request received in accordance with this provision may be granted by the Coalition upon proof of the impossibility to perform based upon an obvious error on the part of the Proposer.
- 11. Notice of Contract Award. The Contract(s) shall be awarded to the Proposer whose Proposal is determined to be the most advantageous to the Coalition, taking into consideration price and technical merits. The Coalition will post a Notice of its Intended Award at www.elcoc.org/whoweare/financials/procurement following the selection of the Successful Proposer. If the notice of award is delayed, in lieu of posting the notice of intended award, the Coalition will post a notice of the delay and a revised date for posting the notice of intended award.
- 12. <u>Public Records/Proposer Trade Secrets.</u> Article 1, Section 24 of the Florida Constitution and Chapter 119, F.S., guarantees every person access to all public records. All information contained within each Proposal submitted to the Coalition pursuant to this RFP is part of the public domain after the Contract is awarded. Proposers must invoke the exemptions to disclosure provided by law, in their Proposals by providing the specific

- statutory authority for the claimed exemption, identifying the data or other materials to be protected, and state the reason, in writing, why the exclusion from public disclosure is necessary. Such claimed exempt information shall be segregated from the remainder of the Proposal. The proposer agrees that no right or remedy for damages shall be had against the Coalition that arises from any disclosure made by Coalition herein, in good faith. Further, Proposer agrees that it shall indemnify, defend and hold the Coalition harmless from and against any losses, expenses, liabilities, costs, (including court costs and reasonable attorney's fees and costs), claims or actions by a third party that relates to Proposer's claimed exemptions herein.
- 13. No Discrimination/Identical or Tie Responses.
